## Private sector capex growth slows in Q4FY25: Avendus Spark

Private capital expenditure (capex) in India remained weak in the fourth quarter of 2024-25, according to Avendus Spark. Despite a 22.7 per cent year-on-year rise in new project announcements across both public and private sectors, private sector announcements grew by only four per cent in the March 2025 quarter.

## S&P cuts India's GDP growth forecast for 2025-26 to 6.3%

S&P Global Ratings has revised India's real GDP growth projection for 2025-26 downwards to 6.3 per cent from 6.5 per cent, citing uncertainty over the US tariff policy and downside risks from its spillover to the economy. It projects the rupee to weaken further, reaching 88 per dollar by the end of 2025, compared to 86.64 in 2024.

#### BCCL's coal output touches 3.4 MT in April 2025

Bharat Coking Coal Limited achieved a record output of 3.4 MT in April 2025. It aims to produce 46 MT of coking coal in 2025-26. The company is an arm of Coal India, which has set a target to achieve 875 MT of coal production in the ongoing financial year.

## OPEC+ agrees to increase oil output by 411,000 bpd in June

OPEC+ has confirmed plans to raise oil production by 411,000 barrels per day (bpd) in June 2025, despite declining prices and concerns over weakening demand, according to media reports. Oil prices fell to a four-year low of USD 60 per barrel in April 2025 after OPEC+ announced a larger-than-expected output increase for May 2025.

#### Govt procures 0.47 mt of tur

The government has procured more than 0.47 million tonne (mt) of tur at the minimum support price (MSP) in the 2024-25 kharif season in major producing states including Maharashtra, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.

The AP government has decided to procure one million tonnes (mt) of paddy over and above the actual target to prevent losses to farmers owing to the recent rains. Paddy with a moisture content of up to 24 per cent will be purchased.

Telangana is actively considering merging all state-level agricultural corporations into a single unified entity. The state agriculture department is in the final stages of preparing a detailed report on the proposed consolidation. ## R R Kabel expects volume to more than double in 2025-26

R R Kabel expects its sales volume to more than double in 2025-26, backed by higher exports due to higher US tariffs on China. The company expects volumes to grow between 16 to 18 per cent. Rajesh Jain, the finance chief of the company, is of the view that US tariff policy will affect Indian exporters less severely than their Chinese rivals.

## Manufacturing PMI rises in April

India's manufacturing sector saw an improvement in growth momentum in April 2025. The HSBC India Manufacturing Purchasing Managers Index (PMI) rose to 58.2 in April, from 58.1 in the previous month. The seasonally adjusted index denotes an expansion when it is above 50, and a contraction when it is below 50.

#### iPhone supplies in India up 25% in March 2025 quarter

Apple's iPhone supplies in India rose by 25 per cent year-on-year in the March 2025 quarter. Its share in India's smartphone market rose to eight per cent during the quarter due to strong demand for premium smartphones and a broader retail presence in India.

MFIs may see lower net interest margins in 2024-25 due to rising delinquencies and falling yields, says a Mavenark Advisors report. After two years of growth helped by RBI's removal of lending rate caps and better asset quality, the sector now faces challenges.

## Indian banks' NIM to squeeze as loan rates fall faster than deposit rates

The return on assets is expected to moderate by 10-20 basis points (bps) to 1.1-1.2 per cent in 2025-26, down from a two-decade high of 1.3 per cent in 2024-25, according to CRISIL Ratings.

Vehicle registrations in India grew by a three per cent to 2.29 million units in April 2025 as two wheeler and passenger vehicles segment recorded subdued growth while commercial vehicle registrations declined. Retail sales of two wheelers and passenger vehicles increased by 2.3 per cent and 1.6 per cent to over 1.68 million units and 349,939 unit, respectively.
