Goa govt notifies revamped Mhaji Bus Scheme

As per the updated scheme, bus operators will receive a fuel subsidy of Rs.3 per km, a 50 per cent reimbursement on annual vehicle insurance premium and assistance of Rs.1 million for replacing buses older than 15 years.

Odisha

The Odisha Cabinet has approved the proposal to merge 'Mamata' scheme with the Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) and rechristen it as MAMATA-PMMVY. Under the newly co-branded scheme, financial assistance for mothers giving birth to a girl child will be increased from Rs.10,000 to Rs.12,000.

Railway Board approves new rail line project between Karhi and Sagma in Madhya Pradesh

The Railway Board has approved a new rail line project between Karhi and Sagma in Madhya Pradesh. The cost of the project has been pegged at Rs.1.6 billion. The proposed chord rail line under the West Central Railway (WCR) zone will be 5.3-km-long.

Punjab

13 MMT of wheat procured in Punjab

The information was shared by state food and civil supplies minister Lal Chand Kataruchak on 16 May 2025. With this, the entire wheat stock that arrived in the grain markets has been procured.

DSR is a cultivation method where paddy seeds are planted directly into the soil, eliminating the need for nursery growth and transplanting, which require fully watered conditions.

The project will also include the upgradation of the trekking route leading to the iconic Living Root Bridges, ensuring a better experience for tourists and hikers.
