Incentives for Food and Seafood Processing Sector under Industrial Policy Resolution 2022 and Odisha Food Processing Policy 2022

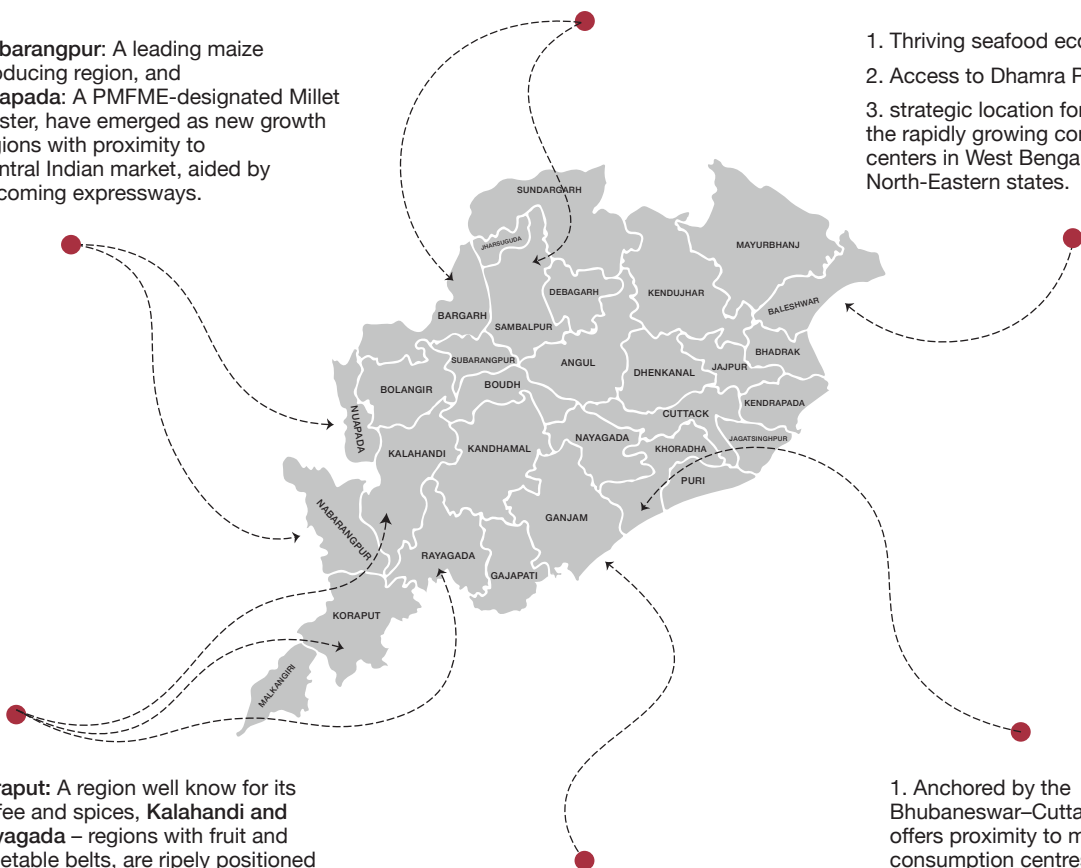
Incentive	Details
Land	At a concessional industrial rate
Stamp Duty	100% stamp duty exemption
Capital Investment Subsidy (Under IPR)	20% capital investment subsidy on actual investment in plant & machinery (excluding the cost of land and building) with no upper cap , disbursed in a phased manner, over a period of 5 years from the date of commencement of commercial production
Capital Investment Subsidy (Under OFPP)	New and Existing Industrial units with investment in plant and machinery up to 50 Crores are eligible for a 30% - 40% Capital Investment Subsidy up to an upper limit of Rs. 5 Crores
Electricity Duty Exemption	100% exemption from payment of Electricity Duty for a period of 7 years from the date of commencement of commercial production
Power Tariff Reimbursement	Reimbursement of Power Tariff of Rs 2.00 per unit consumed and purchased from local DISCOMs/GRIDCO for a period of 7 years from the date of commencement of commercial production
Renewable Energy Benefits	100% exemption/reimbursement of cross subsidy surcharge & additional surcharges and state transmission charges on renewable energy procured from state-based renewable energy plants/GRIDCO for a period of 7 years from the date of procurement of renewable energy for commercial production in the state.
SGST Reimbursement	Reimbursement of 100% of net SGST paid , overall limited to 200% of the cost of plant and machinery (for units in Biju Economic Corridor , the overall limit is 300% of the cost of plant and machinery)
Employment Subsidy	100% reimbursement of employer contribution towards ESI and EPF Scheme for a period of 5 years from the date of commencement of commercial production for skilled and semi-skilled workers, who are domicile of the state
Environment-Friendly Infrastructure Incentives	Subsidy of 25% of the investment in new plant & machinery and the cost of new technical civil works will be provided for the following green measures up to the maximum total limit of Rs. 10 crores per industrial unit: Green Buildings Waste Water Treatment Facilities Effluent Treatment Plant Deep sea discharge facility Up to 50% of capital subsidy on cost of relevant equipment up to a maximum of Rs.10 crore per industrial unit for setting up of new facilities as certified by Odisha State Pollution Control Board (OSPCB) for practicing at least 50% wastewater recovery through Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD)
Captive Solar Plant (Under OFPP)	25% Additional Capital Investment Subsidy for the cost of setting up captive solar subject to an upper limit of Rs. 25 Lakhs
Assistance for Reefer Vehicles (Under OFPP)	Financial assistance in the form of credit linked back-ended subsidy of 35% of the cost of standalone new Reefer Vehicle (s)/Mobile Pre-Cooling Van (s) up to a maximum limit of Rs. 25 Lakhs
Promotional Activities (Under OFPP)	Assistance up to Rs. 2 Lakhs for organizing seminars/ workshops approved by MSME Department, Government of Odisha Assistance of 50% of expenditure up to Rs. 2 Lakhs for domestic study tour/exposure visits Assistance of up to 50% of the cost subject to a maximum limit of Rs. 4 Lakhs for conducting studies/surveys/feasibility report

Food Processing Ecosystem in Odisha

Serves as a gateway to western Odisha, a rapidly growing and affluent population which has witnessed a recent surge in FMCG consumption including premium goods.

Nabarangpur: A leading maize producing region, and **Nuapada:** A PMFME-designated Millet cluster, have emerged as new growth regions with proximity to Central Indian market, aided by upcoming expressways.
