Cabinet Decisions

Cabinet approves equity support to Small Industries Development Bank of India

The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved an equity infusion of Rs. 5,000 crore into the Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI). The capital will be infused by the Department of Financial Services in three tranches—Rs. 3,000 crore in FY 2025–26, and Rs. 1,000 crore each in FY 2026–27 and FY 2027–28, at the prevailing book value of the respective financial years. Following this infusion, the number of MSMEs receiving financial assistance from SIDBI is expected to increase from 76.26 lakh at the end of FY 2025 to about 102 lakh by FY 2028, adding nearly 25.74 lakh new beneficiaries. Based on official MSME data indicating average employment of 4.37 persons per unit, this expansion could generate an estimated 1.12 crore additional employment opportunities by FY 2027–28.

The infusion is aimed at strengthening SIDBI's capital base in view of the anticipated growth in its credit portfolio, particularly in collateral-free digital lending and venture debt support for start-ups. As risk-weighted assets increase, additional capital is required to maintain a healthy Capital to Risk-weighted Assets Ratio (CRAR). The phased equity support will help SIDBI maintain CRAR above mandated levels, protect its credit rating, and mobilize resources at competitive rates, thereby enhancing affordable credit flow to MSMEs.

Cabinet approves continuation of Atal Pension Yojana (APY) and extension of funding support for promotional and developmental activities and gap funding till 2030-31

The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved the continuation of the Atal Pension Yojana (APY) up to FY 2030–31, along with extension of funding support for promotional activities and gap funding. The decision ensures sustained government backing to expand outreach among unorganised sector workers and maintain the scheme's long-term viability.

Under the extended framework, government support will cover awareness generation, capacity building, and other promotional initiatives to increase enrolment, as well as gap funding to ensure financial sustainability. The move aims to strengthen old-age income security for millions of low-income workers and deepen financial inclusion as India progresses towards becoming a pensioned society.

Launched on 9 May 2015, APY provides a guaranteed minimum pension of Rs. 1,000 to Rs. 5,000 per month from the age of 60, depending on contributions. As of 19 January 2026, the scheme has enrolled over 8.66 crore subscribers, emerging as a key pillar of India's social security framework. The extension reflects the Government's continued commitment to inclusive growth and the vision of *Viksit Bharat @2047*.

Indian exporters are facing significant challenges as Indonesia tightened control on commodities, including groundnuts, rice, sugar, onions, garlic, shallots and chillies. Indonesian authorities seized 1.5 million tonnes (mt) of rice, nearly 0.1 mt of sugar, 67,218 tonnes of shallots, 44,640 tonnes of garline, 7,800 tonnes of onions, about 5,000 tonnes of dried chillies and 1,700 tonnes of groundnuts (peanuts).

Aviation

DGCA directs airline operators to appoint 'Chief of Flight Safety' to ensure safety

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has directed airline operators to appoint a 'Chief of Flight Safety' to ensure implementation of safety protocols. This comes as accident investigations consistently point to recurring causal factors and systemic deficiencies within aviation operations. The DGCA asked the operators to set up a dedicated 'Flight Safety Department' with adequate number of competent personnel for promoting flight safety and implementing accident/incident prevention programme in a bid to prevent accidents or incidents.

Refiners' oil import bill declines 8.5 per cent in December 2025

Refiners' oil import bill declined by 8.5 per cent in December 2025, according to the Petroleum Planning and Analysis Cell (PPAC). The drop was due to the falling global crude oil prices. In December, refiners spent USD 9.7 billion to import 20.8 million tonnes of crude oil, down from USD 10.6 billion spent on 20.2 million tonnes during the same month last year.

India-UAE outcomes across investment, technology and people-to-people ties

The visit resulted in a broad set of outcomes covering investment, technology, energy, trade, and cultural cooperation. Key understandings include investment collaboration for development of a Special Investment Region in Gujarat, joint initiatives for space industry growth, and a framework for deeper strategic defence cooperation. Energy security was strengthened through a long-term LNG supply agreement and plans for advanced nuclear collaboration. India-Myanmar Joint Trade Committee reviews trade and connectivity agenda

The ninth meeting of the Joint Trade Committee was held in Nay Pyi Taw to review progress on bilateral trade and economic cooperation. Discussions focused on improving connectivity, easing financial transactions, strengthening border infrastructure, reopening trade posts, promoting the Rupee-Kyat settlement mechanism, and enhancing gains from AITIGA. EU suspends GSP export benefits; to impact India's shipments

The European Union (EU) has suspended export benefits to sectors such as textiles and plastics under a preferential scheme for India and two other countries from January 1, a move that will impact the country's shipment to the 27-nation bloc.

The development is important as the two sides are likely to announce the closure of negotiations for a free trade agreement (FTA) on January 27.

According to the Official Journal of the European Union, the European Commission on September 25, 2025, laid down rules for the application of the regulation with regard to the suspension for 2026-2028 of certain tariff preferences granted to certain GSP beneficiary countries - India, Indonesia and Kenya.
